Who are the Lake Travis Fire Explorers? Lake Travis Explorers is the upcoming Explorer post hosted by Lake Travis Fire Rescue (ESD 6). Explorer posts are a Scouting America program offering career experience to young adults aged 15 - 20 in various fields, including the fire service.

What is an explorer?

An explorer is a young adult aged 15 - 20 interested in learning more about their chosen career path, such as the fire service.

Why be an explorer?

As an explorer, you can learn if a career is right for you, build your college or professional resume, and learn new skills. Even if you decide not to pursue the career, you can learn valuable lessons like professional conduct, time management, resilience, and stress management.

Who can be an explorer?

Any young adult aged 15 - 20 can be an explorer, though basic expectations are similar to those for any extracurricular activity. Explorers over 18 will also be subject to a background check and will need to take Scouting's Youth Protection Training.

What is the commitment?

Explorers are expected to attend 75% of all meetings, which will occur twice a month. If an explorer misses over 75% of meetings, arrangements must be made with the program organizer for makeup sessions. There will also be opportunities to shadow a professional firefighter or other department employees.
